## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1. ABOUT SAHEI

**SAHEI (SRDE's Association of Higher Education Institutions)** is an Association of Higher Education Institutions. It has been formed to provide services to the member Institutions for facilitating their various activities. It is striving to foster better quality, wider reach and higher knowledge standards among the members.

The flagship activity of SAHEI is the **National Aptitude Test (NAT)**. NAT, conducted nation-wide is geared to assess the aptitude of candidates for courses of study in **vocational, professional, management and allied** areas at both undergraduate and post-graduate levels. Accordingly, NAT is conducted at two levels: **NAT-UG for undergraduate level and NAT-PG for post-graduate level programmes.**

### 1.2. The Society

SAHEI operates under the aegis of **Society for Research and Development in Education (SRDE)**, a non-profit society set-up under the Societies Registration Act of 1860. The society is committed to encourage positive educational experiences to meet the challenges and demands of globalised environment. It aims to provide educational services that are reliable, cost effective and are globally recognized. These services are designed to make Indian Higher Education system competitive at International level utilising latest knowledge based technology.

### 1.3. Objective & Scope of NAT:

SAHEI seeks to cater to the diverse needs of the Indian Higher Education system. It primarily aims to meet the needs of holding a single Common Entrance Test for facilitating vocational, professional, management and allied programme admissions in Higher Education Institutions for the benefit of both the candidates as well as the Universities & Institutions at large. There has been a significant increase in the number of Higher Education seekers and providers which is further bound to increase with time. As entrance criteria is a very vital component for the success of any academic programme; NAT seeks to address this need and do away with multiple tests in the system at both the UG & PG Levels. The NAT scores also provides the criteria for SAHEI to offer scholarships and awards each year.

### 1.4. Quality

SRDE commenced its operations in 2004 and stands apart from other testing services being offered in India in terms of both range and scope of testing operations and services. The ultimate credibility and quality of any testing service depends on its continuous research and development and its operations namely; the contents and purpose of the tests, testing methodology and finally the efficiency and effectiveness of the test-conducting mechanism. These also happen to be the priority areas of activity for the Society for Research and Development in Education (SRDE) under which SAHEI is functioning. To ensure academic relevance and its reliability there is an Advisory Board and Academic Council which not only reviews the testing activities but also provides necessary input from the various developments in diverse fields to make the tests more meaningful and up-to-date in terms of its objectives and contents.

## 2. PARTICIPATION CRITERIA

### 2.1. The following institutions/organizations are eligible to participate in NAT testing system:

- Universities recognised by University Grants Commission, Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India
- Institutes & colleges approved by the statutory bodies like AICTE, etc.
- Other Higher Education Institutions.

## 2.2. Candidates

All candidates at the Under Graduate and Post Graduate levels (passed/appeared/appearing) are eligible to appear for NAT.

## 3. ELIGIBILITY

### 3.1. NAT-UG [ Under-graduate ]

**Eligibility :** Candidates who have passed or appeared / are going to appear in the 10+2 of recognised Boards in 2010 are eligible to appear for NAT-UG and their results will be valid only if they clear the Senior Secondary or equivalent examination of the approved Boards.

### 3.2. NAT-PG [ Post-graduate ]

**Eligibility :** Candidates who have passed or appeared / are going to appear in the final year of the graduate degree courses of UGC /AICTE recognised Universities / Institutions in 2010 are also eligible to appear for NAT-PG and their results will be valid only if they clear the qualifying examination.

## 4. HOW TO APPLY FOR TAKING NAT-UG OR NAT-PG

- 4.1. The candidates have to fill in the enclosed OMR registration form for NAT-UG or NAT-PG as the case may be. Please ensure that relevant option of NAT-UG or NAT-PG as the case may be is properly filled in. In case option is not filled, the form will be summarily rejected.
- 4.2. The specimen Registration Form for NAT duly filled in with the data of a specimen candidate is enclosed on **page 13** of this Bulletin. Please read it carefully before filling in the **actual Registration Form**. Please send the filled-up Registration form at an early date, so that it reaches SRDE-SAHEI, A-1/4, Sector 8, ROHINI, DELHI 110085 on or before 7th May, 2010.
- 4.3. **Registration form complete in all respect be mailed after affixing necessary postal stamps by ordinary post only or it can be dropped in the box kept for the purpose at the above address. Any other mode / manner of sending the Registration form (Speed Post, Registered Post, Courier Mail) would not be acceptable.**
- 4.4. Along with the Registration Form, no certificate or document should be attached. ***The Registration Form should not be stapled, wrinkled or damaged in any manner.*** On receipt of the Registration Form the **Admit Card (with details of Roll No., address of the test venue, etc.) will be uploaded on the website [www.srde.org](http://www.srde.org) and no individual admit cards / communication shall be sent to candidates individually.**
- 4.5. Candidates are responsible for the accuracy of the information provided in the Registration Form.
- 4.6. **Non-obtaining of Admit Card:** In case you are not able to view / download your admit card by **seven days** before the test date from NAT website [www.srde.org](http://www.srde.org) ; you may contact the SAHEI Office in New Delhi to check whether your Registration Form was received by SAHEI Office. Still in case of any problem regarding the admit card, you may follow the instructions on the website regarding appearing in the test and / or obtaining Duplicate Admit cards. You must obtain your Admit Card in order to appear for the test. **Candidates without the Admit card will not be allowed to appear for the test.**

4.7. Change of Test center is not allowed.

## 5. TEST ADMINISTRATION

- 5.1. NAT will be administered in the premises of colleges/institutes/schools, etc. (i.e. Test Centres) in various cities/towns.
- 5.2. **The Admit Card of each candidate will contain all the required information such as Roll number** of the candidate, address of the Test Centres, reporting time, etc. alongwith important instructions.
- 5.3. **The candidates must report to the Test Centres with their admit card at least half-an-hour** before the commencement of the test.

## 6. NATURE OF THE NAT TEST

NAT will be conducted for

- 1) Under-graduate level i.e. NAT- UG
- 2) Post-graduate level i.e. NAT- PG

The medium of the question paper will be English only

### 6.1. STRUCTURE OF NAT- UG

- (i) NAT-UG question paper contains 170 questions divided into five sections.
- (ii) **Total time for the Test is 2½ hours.**
- (iii) The questions will be set as follows:

  - **Total time allotted: 150 minutes**

- 6.3. **Each multiple-choice question is followed by four answers numbered A,B,C and D. You have to choose the correct or best answer from these four choices and then darken the corresponding oval in the Answer Sheet.**
- 6.4. The questions in the Test are numbered serially starting at 1 and continuously till the end of the paper. Start answering from the first question of each section and proceed serially.

- 6.5. Clear familiarity with the directions and questions is necessary. It is important to read the directions for each set of questions carefully.
- 6.6. In case you find a mistake in the framing of a question or the answer-choices given or both, you need not waste your time on them. You will be given credit for any such question.
- 6.7. **Time should be wisely allotted within the limits. On an average, there will be less than one minute available for each question.**
- 6.8. NAT has been designed as a standard, reliable test of high quality and appropriate academic standard. NAT scores are useful in determining a candidates' relative position in the whole test population. It is, therefore, advised to proceed through the test at an even pace, skipping the more difficult questions, wherever necessary. The examinee can return to the unanswered questions later.
- 6.9. All the necessary instructions and guidelines will be given in the test Booklet itself.

## 7. SCORING

- 7.1. **For each correct or best answer, you will get a score of one. For any question not answered, a zero score will be given.**

## 8. AT THE END OF THE TEST

- 8.1. You should remain in your seat during the Test. You may leave your seat only after being permitted by the Invigilator/ Test supervisor.
- 8.2. At the end of the Test time, each candidate must hand over the Question Booklet and the Answer sheet to the Invigilator/Test supervisor, before leaving the examination hall/room.

## 9. CANCELLATION OF THE TEST RESULTS

- 9.1. A candidate's score will be cancelled if any misconduct or unfair practice or any other offence of the candidate is detected.

## 10. REPORTING AND USE OF NAT SCORES

- 10.1. Each candidate will receive his/her NAT score after the declaration of the result.
- 10.2. The candidates can download their own score card from NAT website after declaration of results for their reference.
- 10.3. The NAT score card for each candidate will contain total scores. These scores are based on raw scores of each candidate and are statistically scaled with reference to the entire Test population. NAT scores cannot be compared directly to other similar Test scores.
- 10.4. In addition to the total score, the Score Card will have percent (%) below data. These indicate the percentage of candidates in the entire NAT Testing population, who have scored below the candidate in that category. For example, if a candidate's score sheet indicates 55%, it means that 55 percent of test candidates scored below him/her. Thus, the percentile score ranks an applicant for a programme, in relation to other applicants, who have taken the Test.
- 10.5. NAT scores is primarily for use by the Institutions for admissions in the forth coming academic session only alongwith any additional criteria the participating institution may notify.
- 10.6. NAT has so far been approved by a number of Institutes, as one of the admission criterion in their undergraduate and post-graduate programmes. Full addresses of these Institutes and details of the programmes offered, are given on **Page 33** as participating Institutions.
- 10.7. **Participating Institutions have the exclusive authority to decide on admissions to their programmes. NAT or SRDE / SAHEI has no role in their admission process. NAT scores will be reported to the student as well as to the Institutions he/she has opted.**

- 10.8. Each candidate, can indicate upto five Institutes in the OMR Registration Form from the list of participating institutions to which the candidate wants NAT scores to be sent.
- 10.9. For additional reporting of the Test score, the candidate should write to SAHEI Office in New Delhi, as per performa on page 11 directly indicating the additional participating Institutions to which his/her scores should be sent, with a fee of Rs. 50/- per Institutions applied for. The fee should be paid in the form of DD in favour of 'SRDE - SAHEI' Payable at New Delhi. SAHEI Office will send these scores within a week of the receipt of the request.
- 10.10. It is a candidates' responsibility to apply directly to the Institutes of their choice for admission separately. SAHEI / SRDE shall not be responsible for the candidate not being able to get admission in the institution of their choice / otherwise.
- 10.11. SAHEI Office will only forward the scores to the Institutes designated by the students. Students are expected to write/apply to the various Institutes for their Forms, within the deadlines for admissions to each Institute as per the Institutions' notifications/prospectus.

### **IMPORTANT POINTS**

1. *Filled-in Registration Form should be sent only by **ORDINARY POST** after affixing necessary postal stamps or it can be dropped in the box kept at SRDE-SAHEI, A-1/4, Sector-8, Rohini, Delhi. Any other mode of sending the filled-up Registration Form (speed post, registered post, courier, etc.) is not acceptable.*
2. *No-certificate or document should be sent along with filled-up Registration Form.*
3. *Candidates can indicate ordinarily upto **FIVE INSTITUTES** to which she/he wants NAT scores to be sent without any additional charge.*
4. *For any enquiry, candidates may write to the SAHEI office in New Delhi, stating their Roll Number, Registration Form Number and Test Date. Enquiries accompanied by a self-addressed and stamped post card/ envelop will elicit a quick reply.*
5. *If any misconduct or unfair practice by the candidate is detected, directly or indirectly by any means, the candidate test score will be cancelled.*

#### **Preparing for the Test**

#### **General Test-taking Suggestions**

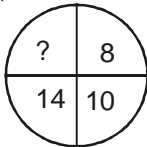

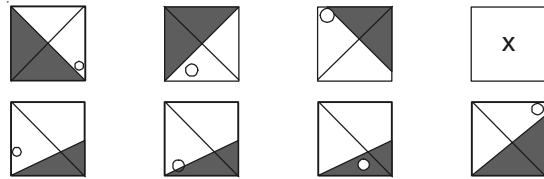

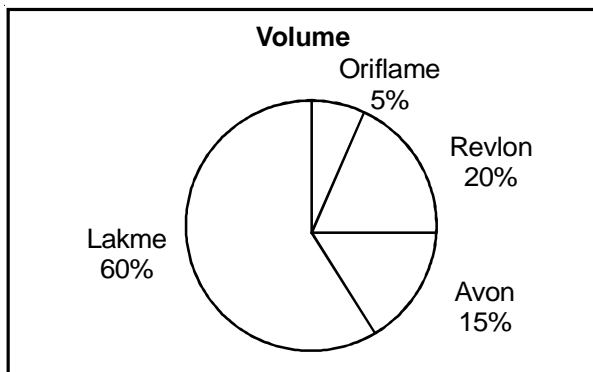
